Demographics

The Robson Valley Region boasts a younger population compared to the rest of north-central B.C., with an average age of 45 years old and around 74.9% of the population being 64 years old or younger. The region has a combined population of 3,229 people, with an average income of \$60,000 per family. Around 43.4% of the local population hold a postsecondary certificate, diploma or degree. English is the dominant language spoken by 91.6% of residents.





Wilderness camping opportunities, lake and river fishing, and a variety of hiking and cross country ski trails are readily available throughout the valley.

Robson Valley Must-Do's

Mount Robson

Explore Mount Robson — The highest peak in the Canadian Rockies where waterfalls, glacial lakes, wildflowers and wildlife draw you in. There are great hiking and camping opportunities at this UNESCO World Heritage Site. Elevation changes means you might experience each of the four seasons, sometimes in a single day.

Ancient Forest/Chun T'oh Whudujut Provincial Park

Quickly becoming one of the "must do" parks to see and hike in British Columbia. Nestled in the traditional territory of the Lheidli T'enneh, the park protects a portion of the only inland temperate rainforest in the world. Hiking the Ancient Forest trail will bring you past thousand year old western redcedars and a rich biodiversity of plants, mosses, lichens and fungi.

Guide services and snowmobile rentals are available to those not familiar with the area, with SPOT Locator devices installed at select locations that can be used in the event of an emergency.




1,660 in the Robson Valley Region labour force

An excellent place to start a business

Business Costs

The Robson Valley Region is an excellent place to start a new business, with competitive labour costs and affordable real-estate. Below you will find information on baseline costs you should factor in when considering starting a business in Robson Valley Region.

Minimum Wage & Overtime

As of June 2020, minimum wage is \$14.60/hour and will be increased to \$15.20/hour in June of 2021. Employees are paid 1.5 times their regular wage after 8 hours a day, up to 12 hours. Employees are paid two times their wage for time worked over 12 hours a day.

Mandatory Benefits

Canada has two federal insurance plans, which employers and employees jointly pay into. There is also a statutory deduction for Worker's Compensation.

Canada Pension Plan (CPP)

The CPP ensures that Canadians have a basic income for retirement. Employers contribute 5.95% of employee wage to a maximum annual contribution of \$3,754.45 (2023).

Employer Contribution Employment Insurance (EI)

El ensures that workers have income available for them should they become unemployed. Employers pay 1.4 times the amount of the employee's premiums and stop deducting premiums when the employee's maximum insurable earnings (\$60,300 for 2022) or the maximum employee premium for the year (\$952.74 for 2022) is reached.

Worker's Compensation

WorkSafeBC collects premiums from businesses to cover the costs of work-related injuries. Your premiums fund the costs associated with work-related injuries or diseases, health care, wage loss, rehabilitation, and administration.

The average base rate for 2022 is 1.55% of employers' assessable payroll. For 2023, the maximum assessable payroll per worker is \$112,800.

Development Process

The Robson Valley Region is made up of three local government planning departments that have services to facilitate development while protecting property rights, community standards and the environment as represented by policy.

Development Services includes:

- Land Use Planning and Bylaw Compliance; and
- Building Inspections.

If you are planning to develop a site within the Robson Valley Region, first discuss your proposal with the appropriate local government planning department before you invest a lot of time and money in your project.

Where applicable, some of the Bylaws that you will need to consult include:

- The Regional District of Fraser-Fort George's Robson Valley-Canoe Electoral Area H Downstream and Upstream Official Community Plans; and
- The respective municipal or regional zoning Bylaw and requirements.

Waste Management

The Robson Valley Region has integrated solid waste management services that includes landfill operations, a network of regional transfer stations, and a variety of waste reduction initiatives including multi-material recycling, yard and garden waste composting and educational programs.

These services and programs are supported by the Regional Solid Waste Management Plan (RSWMP) which is a plan required by British Columbia legislation.

Local government provides essential basic services – clean water, garbage collection, fire and police protection, street lighting, libraries, recreational facilities and parks, local roads, water and sewer systems, and planning for the future economic growth of the community. The range of local services provided by BC's local governments is as diverse as the provincial landscape and is decided by each individual council and board.

Local governments raise funds to provide and maintain services and amenities within the communities. These revenues are raised from four main sources: Property Taxes, Grants from other levels of government, Special user charges, and Partnership.

Federal and Provincial Taxes

Canada has a five percent (5%) value-added tax called the Goods and Services Tax (GST). It is fully recoverable for all business inputs.

British Columbia has a seven percent (7%) sales tax. Various business inputs are exempt from the tax, including production machinery and equipment, software development, construction labour and various materials.
